

The Guards Museum





The Guards Museum is one of many essential London attractions with those tourists fascinated by London's royal history. The Guards Museum collates artifacts and information relating to the five regiments of foot guards: the Welsh Guards, Irish Guards, Scots Guards, Grenadier Guards and Coldstream Guards. The Guards have a responsibility for protecting London, for the Queen's military security and for ceremonial duties in London.

The Guards Museum tells the history of the guards, from the 17th century origins through to the modern day. The museum's highlights include a sartorial history of the guards, showing the different regiments' evolving uniform from through the centuries; and an eclectic collection of paintings, drawings and sculptures that depict the regiments' military history.

The Guards Museum's cheap entry (just £4.00 for adults and free entry for children) ensure that a trip to the museum is a great option for those tourists looking for low-cost things to do in central London.
