

# Handel House Museum







25 Brook Street, London



**Handel House Museum** at 25 Brook Street, London was home to the great baroque composer George Frideric Handel. He lived here from 1723 until his death in 1759, and composed some of the greatest music in history, including *Messiah*, *Zadok the Priest* and *Music for the Royal Fireworks*.

The museum celebrates Handel's life and works, displaying portraits of Handel and his contemporaries in finely restored Georgian interiors and by bringing live music back to his house. Frequent music rehearsals, weekly concerts and special musical events in addition to regular displays and exhibitions bring Handel's world to life.

### Opening times

Tuesday to Saturday 10am - 6pm (until 8pm on Thursday) Sunday 12 noon - 6pm Closed Mondays, including bank holidays.

Last admissions half an hour before closing. During busy periods, tickets may be timed.

#### Admission charges

£6.00 adults

£5.00 concessions

£2.00 children (5-16 years). Children get FREE ENTRY on Saturdays and Sundays.

Free entry for children under 5 years, Friends of Handel House, National Art Pass holders, London Pass card holders (on presentation of membership cards) and disabled visitors' carer.

Concessions apply to senior citizens, full-time students, registered disabled and ES40 cardholders on presentation of proof of status.

#### Historical rooms

For your own safety, you are advised to wear sensible shoes when visiting as the museum contains original 18th century floors which can be uneven. Stilettos damage the original flooring and leather soled-shoes are particularly unsuitable. Please note that certain rooms have low lighting.

#### Recitals and Events
