

Sightseeing Times & Prices

Opening Times & Information

- St Paul's Cathedral is open for sightseeing from Monday to Saturday between 8.30am 4pm.
- Last tickets are sold at 4pm and the cathedral closes for sightseeing at 4.30pm.
- On Sunday the cathedral is open for worship only and there is no sightseeing.
- The price of admission includes entry to the cathedral floor, crypt and the three galleries in the dome (Whispering, Stone and Golden). Admission also includes multimedia guides and guided tours (for individuals and family visitors).
- The three galleries in the dome are open to sightseers from Monday to Saturday between 9.30am 4.15pm (last admission). Please note that children must be accompanied by an adult when visiting the galleries.
- Special services or events may occasionally close all, or part, of the cathedral. Check the **cathedral** calendar before you visit.
- **Filming and photography** is not allowed inside the cathedral.

Guided Tours

Introductory Talks (no extra cost above admission)

A brief introduction (15-20 minutes) to the history and architecture of the cathedral.

Introductory Talks are recommended for those with limited time. Talks run regularly throughout the day, please enquire at the guiding desk when you arrive at the cathedral.

Guided Tours (no extra cost above admission)

A guided tour of the cathedral and crypt which lasts for 90 minutes and usually commence at 10am, 11am, 1pm and 2pm (spaces are limited on these popular tours). Please reserve a place at the guiding desk when you arrive at the cathedral (it is not possible to make reservations in advance). The tour takes in the cathedral church floor and the crypt. It also visits the famous Geometric Staircase, the Chapel of St. Michael & St. George as well as the Quire which are areas that are not usually available to members of the public.

The tour covers the history of St. Paul's, its architecture as well as many of the tombs and memorials that are in the cathedral, including Sir Christopher Wren, Wellington and Nelson to name but a few.

There are places where you are able to sit during the tour.

Group Tours

A private tour for groups of 10+ can be arranged in advance. An additional charge of £3 per adult, £2.50 per senior/student and £1 per child will apply. There is a minimum charge of £30 for private tour bookings. Prices quoted are valid to 31 December 2013.

Triforium Tour

This guided tour lasts approximately 1 hour. It costs £20 per person, which includes entry into the cathedral and access to the crypt and galleries. Tours must be booked as a group of 5 or more and in advance.

The tours are available for bookings on Mondays and Tuesdays at 1130am and 2pm, and Friday afternoons at 2pm. Other times may be available by prior arrangement (without a visit to the library.)

The Triforium Tour includes a glimpse of the library and the Geometric Staircase, as well as a spectacular view from the west end down the nave. The visit culminates in the Trophy Room, where Wren's Great Model, based on an early plan for the cathedral in the form of a Greek cross, is on display. You can admire this intricate feat of craftsmanship which reflects the design Wren most desired for St Paul's, but which he was obliged to recast along more conventional lines to give us the magnificent St Paul's of today.
