


## City of Westminster Jewel Tower





**The Jewel Tower** dates back over 700 years and is an intriguing visitor attraction in the heart of Westminster. It was built around 1365 to house Edward III's treasures and was known as the 'King's Privy Wardrobe'.

One of only two buildings from the medieval Palace of Westminster to survive the fire of 1834, the tower features a 14th century ribbed vault.

It displays a fascinating exhibition about the history of Parliament – 'Parliament Past and Present', and the second floor includes panels telling the story of this small but important building.
