

HMS Belfast





A visit to **HMS Belfast** is one of the essential London attractions with those fascinated by history, war or the armed forces. HMS Belfast was launched in 1938; saw service in World War II, including support of the D Day landings; continued service until 1963; and then became a museum ship in 1971, becoming part of the **Imperial War Museum** in 1978.

It is the only surviving ship of its type to have played a role in WWII. HMS Belfast is moored by the Southbank of the Thames. Visitors are advised to put aside around ninety minutes when visiting HMS Belfast. There are several other top London attractions in very close proximity, including the historic Tower of London, the iconic Tower Bridge and the scary London Dungeon. Why not visit all four in one day

Explore HMS *Belfast*'s nine decks to discover the stories of life on board this warship during the Second World War and beyond. Imagine sleeping in one of the tightly packed hammocks during duties in Arctic waters, or being stationed deep in the bowels of the ship when she opened fire in support of Allied troops on D-Day. Venture into the interactive Operations Room, and immerse yourself in the midst of a battle in our Gun Turret Experience.
